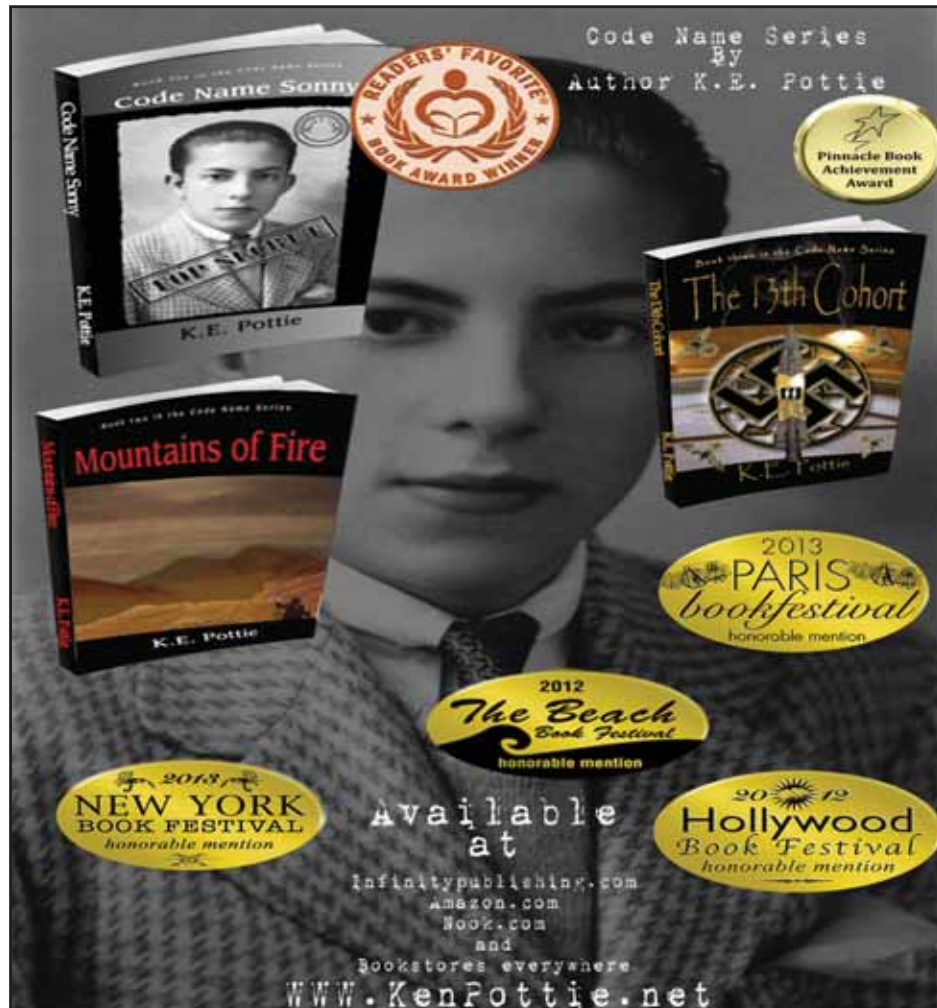

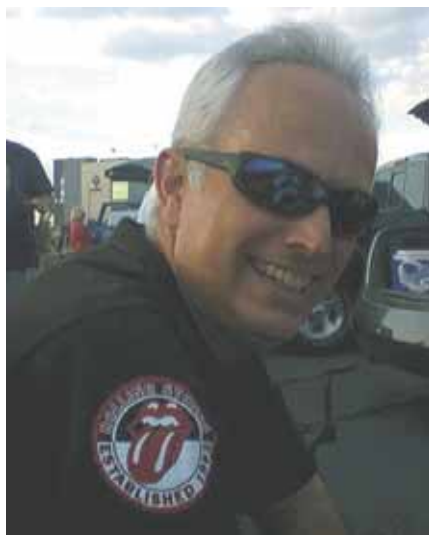

MUSIC NOTES



“The Legend of Paul Revere”

“In a little town in Idaho way back in '61,
A man was frying burgers, gee - it seemed like lots of fun.
But to his friend the bun boy he confessed its misery
'I think I'd like to start a group so come along with me'...”

It was one of the first four 45s that I bought, way back in 1966. The other three were the Monkees' “I'm a Believer,” Johnny Rivers' “Secret Agent Man,” and the New Vaudeville Band's “Winchester Cathedral.”

How and why I remember these things never ceases to amaze me, but, it was the fourth one that really got to me, and has stayed with me to this day.

It was a song called “Kicks” by a group called Paul Revere & The Raiders.

“And all youth stations across the nation
Please play our records for your congregation.”

I remember that the first time I heard it was when I was lying on the sand at Williams Beach in Mystic, my trusty battery-powered transistor radio propped up on the blanket next to me.

I was a mere 10 years old at the time, and the concept of rock 'n' roll was still a puzzle to me.

But, then I heard that guitar and drums intro to the song, and I was immediately hooked, and Paul Revere & The Raiders helped sent me on this wild, long, and, yes at times, strange trip that's still soaring after 48 years. Just like me (pun intended), youngsters everywhere bought the record, and after a few relatively minor hits, Paul Revere and his gang were on their way.

“The band soon started booming, they were raking in the coin;
They found few new musicians, and persuaded them to join;
And Paul Revere decided since they had such new-found fame
'We need a fancy title,' and The Raiders they became...”

I'm recalling this now because Paul Revere Dick (he, thankfully, dropped his surname professionally), the founding father of this great half-pop, half-garage band, along with the incredible singer and front man Mark Lindsay, passed away last month, shortly after retiring from more than half a century of live performances and recordings.

“They soon packed up for Hollywood,
to reap their fortunes there;
But streets aren't really paved with gold,
and you can't live on air.”

Revere, who was the band's organist and a manic stage presence right up to his retirement, started the band in 1958. He initially named it the Downbeats, but he changed it to the Raiders in 1960. In 1963, they recorded their version of the now-classic “Louie, Louie,” and started on their way.

“And then Dick Clark approached them,
said I know a thing or two,
I'll put you on a TV show,
and make big stars of you.”

Clark, who was seemingly impressed with both the band's sound and their look, which incorporated Revolutionary War-era costumes on stage, made them the proverbial house band on his afternoon show, “Where the Action Is,” which was a mega-popular spinoff of the seminal “American Bandstand.” Buoyed by their new-found popularity generated by Clark, the group also performed on the “The Ed Sullivan Show.”

“Now things are going groovy,
and we really can't complain,
though the pace of rock 'n' rolling
nearly drives us all insane.”

Insane or not, after Dick Clark and “Kicks,” the hits just kept on coming. “Hungry,” “Just Like Me,” “Good Thing,” “Him or Me,” “Too Much Talk,” “Don't Take It So Hard,” “Indian Reservation,” and a bunch more. Lindsay left the band in 1975, but Revere continued on the road until early this year.

In a statement posted on his web site, Lindsay wrote:

“We all know that Paul had been very ill for a while, and you always hope for the best -- a miracle, maybe. But it just wasn't to be this time. It is still surreal to think that he is gone. I'm sure this cannot be an easy time for Sydney and all of Paul's family, and I wish them all the best, and peace.

“In 1958, Revere and I got together in Idaho, and it clicked. We had a great run, and for a real long stretch, it was magic. All good things seem to come to an end, though, and eventually Revere and I drifted apart and went our separate ways.

“But, I want to remember the good times, when he was my best friend and we were partners, and the world was ours for a while. Right now I would like to think he's playing wild boogie-woogie on that big golden upright in the sky. Play on, brother, see you down the road.”

“Everybody's bushing, saying give it all you can,
come to think of it, our business manager's
our biggest fan.”

That is, unless you include a little, impressionable kid from Mystic.

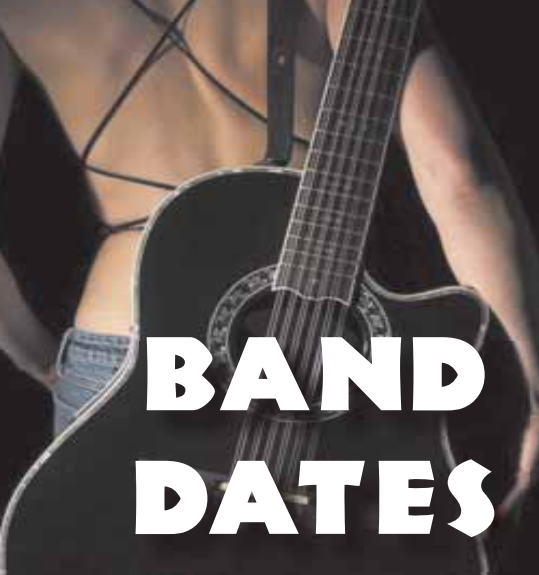

Straight to VHS Gets the Fall Crowd Rolling At 33 Golden

Upon strolling down Golden Street, New London this October, I walked down into the bar at 33 Golden bar only to come face to face with Doctor Gasp playing surfy songs about mouthfuls of candy corn . . . artfully crooning about vampires and bones in baritone before going falsetto on his great cover of early 60s hit "Monster Mash." Gasp's fun stage act energized the crowd to get ready

for Straight to VHS, who showcased live performances of their new album "Weekend Weekend Weekend."

The band Straight to VHS consists of tall bassist Tim Donnel, drummer Jay Silva and frontman/guitarist Jon Young. Jon's cool turquoise guitar and howling vocals kicked things off on "You're On Your Own Now" with the great "Oh No!" chorus. "Going Crazy" and "Walking Dead" were next, in which the band sounded a bit like the Dead Kennedys. The flannel-and-leather-laced crowd showed that Fall is finally upon us as customers relaxed in dark cavernous tables and familiar local characters sipped beer and mellowly puffed electronic cigarettes. The band's fiery rock energy was a perfect backdrop to a fun night out with friends.

The band met 5 years ago at 2-Wives Pizza when Jay agreed to play drums for Jon on a cheap drum kit (while completely sober). The bassist Tim had been with the band for 2 years after creative differences caused their former bassist to part ways. The band had become accustomed to and comfortable with having Tim around and they clicked instantaneously with his fast-playing bassist musicianship.

The band describes their new album "Weekend weekend weekend" as like a best friend which they would play for a living if necessary. Some key tunes off the album include "Sore Loser" whose chorus slowly creeps along amidst violent lyrics about cannibalistic sex . . . ending with a guitar that chugs along after slowing down to a 1-string groove. Other tunes include "Casino Baby" with its tremolo guitar and seductive lyrics about staying up until dawn. The themes of losing money and friends are prevalent on the country-tinged "Mountain Song," whose twangy riff speeds up as Jon sings of loneliness, death and whiskey. Jon's tragic car accident put a halt to recording with their CT College sound engineer, but the loyal support of friends hastened his recovery . . . providing impetus and urgency towards finishing this fine new record. .

"Punk Rock Black Girls" and "Yeah Yeah Yeah" are among the band's favorites off their new album: the former with its vocal whoos and the latter with its 3-beat-3 chord chorus. The band even sounds a bit like the Buzzcocks on "I Can Sing Like a Bitch Too." The highlight of the show was when drummer Jay threw off his shirt and stepped into the spotlight on guitar..his arms afrenzy as he jammed away to "Punk Rock Black Girls." Their edgy guitar and bass-lines-played-at-the-speed-of-light leave a lot of positive things to say about Straight to VHS and their crowd anticipate many more good shows to come!

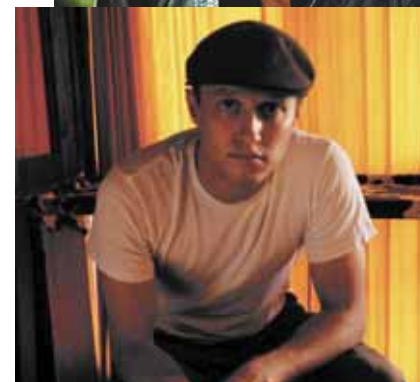

Can you judge a musician by the company he keeps? If so then what does that say about Doyle Bramhall II? He's a producer who has worked with the likes of Sheryl Crow and Willie Nelson. He's a guitarist who by the time he was eighteen years old was already on the road as a special guest of the Fabulous Thunderbirds. Since then he's recorded and/or toured with such notables as Roger Waters, Derek Trucks, Susan Tedeschi, BB King, and Eric Clapton. In fact these past several years Eric rarely takes the stage without Doyle by his side. He's also played with T-Bone Burnett, Elton John, Gary Clark Jr., Gregg Allman, Dr. John, and countless others. He just finished up the Experience Hendrix tour where he was part of a tribute to Jimi that included Buddy Guy, Kenny Wayne Shepherd, Jonny Lang, Eric Johnson, Rich Robinson, Zakk Wilde, Chris Layton, Ana Popovic, Eric Gales, and Billy Cox. How's that for company?

The fact that Doyle Bramhall II is a virtuoso musician was practically pre-ordained. His father, Doyle senior, was a mainstay on the Texas blues scene. When his dad was in high school he started a band with Jimmie Vaughan called the Chessman. In fact they once opened for Jimi Hendrix in Dallas. A few years later he was in a band with Jimmie's younger brother Stevie Ray called The Nightcrawlers. Doyle Bramhall went on to have an excellent solo career culminating in his critically acclaimed 1994 release called "Bird Nest on the Ground." Both father and son played on that record. Sadly, Doyle passed away at the much too early age of 62 back in 2011.

The younger Doyle first started to make a name for himself back in the early nineties with a band called Arc Angels. The band's name is an acronym of the Austin Rehearsal Complex where many a jam session took place. This is a group that featured Charlie Sexton along with Double Trouble's Tommy Shannon and Chris Layton. They formed shortly after Double Trouble's lead singer and guitarist extraordinaire Stevie Ray Vaughan died tragically in a helicopter crash.

Doyle Bramhall II has always been a fascinating dude. He's left handed but he plays a right handed guitar strung upside-down. It's rare to see someone play this way but it certainly works for him. Like his father, Doyle is also a great looking guy with perhaps the most magnificent head of hair in all of rock and roll. Not even a young Bon Jovi or Van Halen could top the hairdo that Doyle is sporting these days! He's also dates the Oscar winning actress Renee Zellweger. He's been in the news lately because she's been

in the news lately! However, the bottom line is that they really are a super cool looking couple and they certainly appear to be quite happy with each other.

Doyle will start a new tour with his own band around the 1st of November. They'll be coming through Westerly, Rhode Island on Saturday November 8th taking the stage at the historic Knickerbocker Café. This phone interview took place on the afternoon of Wednesday October 1st.

BH – I understand that you're finally working on a new CD?

DB - "I'm actually on tour right now with Experience Hendrix but I'm trying to go into the studio on the off days but I'm definitely writing. When I get back off this tour and in between other tours I'm doing I'll be in a studio working on a release next year."

BH – Will the new CD be made with the same set of musicians or will you be using a variety of special guests?

DB - "I don't know. At the moment it will probably be me playing a lot of the stuff on it. I just went in the studio and recorded a few songs and I was playing drums, bass, guitar, and keyboard stuff. So it will probably be just a mixture of all kinds of things. I have gathered a lot of musicians over the years that I respect so I'll probably have a lot of different people coming in and out to play on it. I do like actually recording myself and putting down my ideas that way."

BH – I was there when the Experience Hendrix tour came through Connecticut in the spring. Where are you now?

DB – "We started in Florida and we're in Texas now. We're going all through the south and up the west coast."

BH – Why do you think the music of Jimi Hendrix still resonates more than forty years after his death?

DB - "I just think that he was just such a powerful composer. He was so innovative on the guitar in every way, melodically, his solos, his guitar parts everything about what he did had a purpose. Everything matches everything, like the guitar tones he got on his solos matched what the melody was conveying. It was like the perfect tone for the perfect melody in a way that was very innovative and had never been done before. I think it still resonates because first of all they're great songs. You have great songs and great melodies and great sounds. You have innovation and not only that but probably the most powerful guitar player that's ever lived. So that shines like a star even after dying. It's still shining."

BH – I also heard that you worked on the new Bettie LaVette CD. I think it's called "Worthy."

DB - "We had done an album a few years ago that had 'Joy' on it and that album, I think it had won a Grammy for her. (The album was the 2005 release "I Got My Own Hell to Raise") We did that record and it was a Joe Henry production. And he just called me up and said that he was doing another Bettie record. I loved the way that one turned out so I said yes. We went back in the studio and spent about four days in Joe's studio and it was fast and furious. I think it might actually beat the first record which was amazing. So I think it's really, really strong and I was really happy for her that she has that album now to go out on tour with."

BH – I heard that you'll be a guest guitarist on Susan Tedeschi's next CD.

DB – "I didn't hear about that but it's possible. I work with Derek Trucks and Susan on the Tedeschi/Trucks albums. I go down and write with them

on go on tour and do cameo appearances with them. So I'm on their record together."

BH – Let's talk about Eric Clapton. I really liked his record "The Breeze: An Appreciation of JJ Cale." It must have been cool to be a part of that?

DB - "It was. I know that Eric flew over to record in the same studio that he had recorded 'The Road to Escondido' which was the JJ Cale and Eric Clapton collaboration before. That was the Ocean Way studio. It was the studio that JJ Cale said he did his first recording in Los Angeles in like 1963 or something, in that same building. It was cool, you know, it was one of the things where Eric asked me to be on the floor and there were five guitar players, most of them from Tulsa with me and Eric. And there were three or four drummers on the floor with a bass player and sometimes two. There were two keyboard players with Walt Richmond (long time Clapton collaborator) of course. But anyway it was amazing to have that many players on the floor and everything makes sense. There was some really beautiful stuff, really old school almost like a little mini-orchestra. He also had special guests come in and out. There were people coming in and out of the studio all day like Tom Petty and David Lindley and it was really cool. I think it showed everybody's real fondness for JJ Cale who is a master to everybody that was in there. It was nice, it was really nice."

BH- What a compliment it must have been to have Eric Clapton and BB King ask you to play on the "Riding with the King" CD that the two of them made together.

DB - "Yeah it was huge because I listened to the album 'Live at the Regal' actually all of BB's records I listened to growing up. I love BB King and that's where I started my guitar playing was through BB and then once I started branching out more with Cream and all the Eric Clapton stuff. So yeah, it was a huge thing for me. I was sort of in disbelief the whole time as I was making my way down to the studio. And then when I walked in the studio, just that alone, I walked in and they were playing one of my songs. Eric was trying to show BB my song and I remember I was in the control room looking through the glass listening to them play it and thinking 'how is this even possible that they're playing my song?' It was so weird. And then Eric spotted me and said 'Hey come meet BB! Come on the floor and grab a guitar.'"

BH – People have commented on how you play your guitar strung upside down. My question to you is I'm surprised that nobody tried to change this habit seeing how you grew up in a musical family surrounded by guitar players.

DB - "Well, I had a guitar around that had really high action and when I first started playing, I actually just started tinkering around on this guitar and it was really hard to play. So I actually put it on my lap and played it like a lap steel and pushed down the notes on the strings off to the fret board that way because I had enough strength to push down the strings that way. If I tried to play it regularly it would just hurt my hands. I learned a lot of songs, strumming and chords, just playing on my lap. And I guess that was turned left-handed but I didn't know that. Once I started playing enough I just pulled the guitar out and started playing holding it the proper way. I was in my room all the time so I didn't come out and I didn't even think about it. It didn't cross my mind that it was left-handed upside down. It didn't mean anything to me because all I was doing was picking up a guitar and playing it. So that's what it was and that's how I held it. So I didn't even think about it until later on I was going to take a lesson or something and the person said 'oh you're holding it the wrong way' and I said 'but I know two hundred songs!' By that time I thought if I have to change the way I play to get taught then maybe I'll just keep going with my own self taught way because it's working out for me."

BH – We recently lost Johnny Winter. Did you know him during your Texas day and is there anything you'd like to say about him?

DB - "I actually didn't cross paths with him too much. He wasn't really in my circle but I remember his old records and the Woodstock days. The stuff that I heard about him was mainly through Tommy Shannon, his bass player who was in the Arc Angels and Stevie Ray's band too. I know that Tommy had just so much respect for Johnny. But I never went to see him but I definitely respected what he did and I really loved that more dobro-acoustic record he did way back."

BH – I know that long time fans of yours ask about the Arc Angels and whether or not you'll be getting back together again. Are there any plans for that in the future?

DB - "Well we've done that a few times and I don't know. It's hard to tell because I'm focusing heavily on my solo career and I've put my solo career on hold for all the other side projects that I've had or for people that I've worked for like Roger Waters and Eric Clapton. So for me, I'm ramping up so much with my thing, and it takes a lot to stay highly motivated to keep doing it just because I have kids now and family. You don't want to spend your entire life, especially then they're in school, away from them. But yet I want to build on my career now so I can hopefully in the future have enough of a fan base around the states and internationally that I can go on tour for four or five months out of the year and have people come out to see shows. But yeah, I'm focusing so much on my thing now. It's been fourteen years since my last solo album so it's hard to think about doing an Arc Angel thing but you never know, maybe. We definitely have chemistry together so if we were to get together and it seemed like a side project we wanted to do once my solo career is more established in this era I think that I'll feel more comfortable with doing that as a side project."

BH – You talked about Derek Trucks and Susan Tedeschi a little earlier. They seem to balance a family life with the demands of a touring band as well as anyone I've ever seen. How are you able to do that?

DB - "For me it's been a little different. Derek and Susan are a mother and father that are together. They're co-parenting together and on the road together. So that makes it easier that they're on the road together. And their whole set up with the brothers and sisters and family and Derek's mom, they all pull together and it's a real family affair with them. The parents come out and bring the kids and they spend a lot of time with them even when they're in school. They have a great routine. The kids are used to it and they grew up with it that way so it's not like taking them out of a structural thing that messes them up. That's what they know and everybody is really cool with it. For me I don't have that. I'm divorced and my kids live with my ex so it's a little tougher. I fly back as much as possible if I'm not on the road and spend as much time as I can with them because that brings me more joy than anything, spending time with my kids."

BH – What kind of band will we see you with when you get to the Knickerbocker Café on Saturday November 8th?

DB - "I'm piecing together the band now and I'm going to be trying out a little different instrumentation in my band. I'm trying out this Hammond organ player that pumps bass on the organ and I have a guitar player that will be switching up playing some bass starts and guitar starts. And I have a drummer who played with Afghan Whigs for years and now he's going to be on this gig with me. It's sort of like having twice as many musicians because the organ player is also playing bass on half the tunes and the guitar player is going to play bass on half the tunes. The drummer that Doyle is referring to is Cully Symington and the second guitarist is Billy Cassis. Both of them are Austin, Texas natives. Besides the Afghan Whigs, Cully has been a part of many bands throughout the years. In fact, over the past decade he has been the drummer on ten different records with ten different bands.

Billy goes back a long way with Doyle. When the two of them aren't together you can usually find him rocking out with his popular Texas band Soul Hat.

Rounding out the group is bass man Ted Pecchio. This guy has played with both the Susan Tedeschi band and Col. Bruce Hampton and the Co-detalkers. Lately he's been seen on stage with the great blues/rock guitarist Tinsley Ellis.

There's been a musical connection between Austin, Texas and Westerly, Rhode Island ever since Jimmie Vaughan hooked up with our own Fran Christina in the early days of the Fabulous Thunderbirds. Jimmie's been on that Knickerbocker Café stage countless times and now Doyle Bramhall II, with all of his rich musical history, keeps that tradition alive. Doyle will finally take his place along side all of the great guitar players who have graced that legendary venue throughout the years. Let's get out there to see him on November 8th and give him and his band mates a rowdy and rocking Rhode Island welcome!

DINING OUT

What a fast summer we had, it's already November. Do not forget to vote. An uncast vote means I do not care what happens to my state, or government. Please cast a vote. November is also the celebration of Veterans Day. Thanks to all of you who are serving and have served. You make it possible for the rest of us to be able to vote.

I am not sure if I am just lucky or I am fishing for tatou (black fish) in the right spots, but there are sure a lot of big fish out there. Good eating too. I have caught my limit every time out of over five pound fish. The season should be longer and the bag limit higher maybe eight fish per angler. I don't see a problem with a lack of fish, DEEP take note. I noticed there are no seals in the sound yet. Those guys eat thirty pounds of fish a day. Could be the reason we have so many fish around. Bad year for bass in the sound but I see twenty pound fish eating the skins of my filets at the dock. Good omen for next year.

The biggest eating holiday of the year, Thanksgiving, is just around the corner. Roast beef or turkey, lobster, crown roast of pork are a few choices of a main dish that can be served. Traditionally turkey is the main item cooked. Break tradition and serve something different. Roast beef is always good. Buy a rib eye, one pound per person should be okay after it is cooked it will reduce to three quarters of a pound. A full rib eye or you could use a sirloin roast, about twelve pounds is enough for ten people or maybe eight, you have to figure shrinkage and waste. When you pick your beef look at the ends and find the fattiest one you can find. Fat means flavor and tenderness. By fat I mean the white in the red meat, it is called marbling, the more the merrier. When you unwrap the roast, wipe it dry with a paper towel. Take equal amounts of salt, black pepper, ground, and granulated garlic place it in a bowl, enough to cover the whole roast on the outside. Rub the mixture on the whole roast especially on the ends. Heat your oven to 400 degrees. Put two inches of a good wine in your roasting pan, you are allowed to taste the wine to make sure it is good wine, this is the base of your au jus. Put the roast in the pan, pan in the oven. Till the roast turns brown about ten minutes. Now turn the oven down to 275 degrees till the temp in the middle of the roast is 110 degrees. ABOUT ONE AND A HALF HOURS. Take your roast out of the oven and let it rest for twenty minutes before cutting. If you have any questions E mail me. Buy a Taylor chefs thermometer and calibrate it, you do not want to overcook the roast. Taylor allows you to calibrate by placing ice in a glass of water and placing the business end of the thermometer in the water, it should read thirty two degrees if it does not move the dial with the wrench provided on the case. For the other items serve them at Christmas. I asked my Grandmother for recipes and she said your Italian you do not need one.

I have been asked to write about hot peppers so here I go. Your taste buds depend on your ability to smell, if you have a cold your ability to taste is not so good. I do not know why anyone would want to punish their taste buds with burning peppers. Some of us do once in a while I guess.

The scale used to rate the hotness of peppers rates the ghost pepper as the eighth hottest pepper. The Carolina reaper is number one, Trinidad moruga scorpion is number two, 7 pot douglak number three, Trinidad scorpion number four, butch t five, maga 6 per is six, 7pot primo number seven, and bhut joikia (GHOST PEPPER) is eighth. If you use any of these wear double gloves to handle them. Be very careful what you touch after you remove the gloves. There are many different types of chili peppers that add good flavor to some dishes. Chile is an item that needs a little heat, and there or many others. Not all chilies are hot jalapeños for example are mild and hot, so are banana peppers. Cooking with spice is fun but be careful. When you cook a hot pepper you are intensifying its strength, taste as you go. So called pepper seeds are crumbled red chilies. Different types of pepper excite different parts of your mouth. Some burning sensations linger some are only momentary. Tabasco sauce is a good example of a momentary hot sensation. And a good spice to use to enhance flavor. It is made in many different degrees of hot. Try the green Tabasco on egg dishes it's wonderful. Black, white, red, green whole pepper seeds, crushed are also good flavor enhancers.
